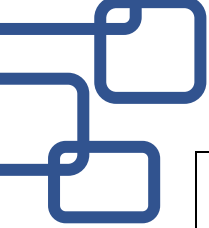

Phase of the lesson	Duration	Description
Warm-up	10 min	<p>The teacher asks questions such as the following to encourage children to think:</p> <p>What does transportation mean?</p> <p>I just went to the market with my car. Is the car a means of transportation?</p> <p>How about getting to know the means of transportation!</p> <p><a href="https://youtu.be/biX7NNxw_w8">https://youtu.be/biX7NNxw_w8</a></p> <p>After the video, the teacher asks the children which means of transportation they like the most.</p>
Main activity	5 min	<p>Where do the vehicles in the video we just watched go? Let's play a game. Let's divide the transportation vehicles into three groups and place the aircraft in Group 1, land vehicles in Group 2, and sea vehicles in Group 3..</p> <p><a href="https://wordwall.net/tr/resource/58556834">https://wordwall.net/tr/resource/58556834</a></p>
	25 min	<p>First, a short conversation with the children:</p> <p>"Children, do you think transportation vehicles cause air pollution? Why?" According to the answers received, the conversation is continued and different questions can be asked.</p> <p>The teacher then makes a short explanation. Smoke from vehicle exhaust pollutes our air. This adversely affects our health and the health of other living things. Fire fumes also pollute the air. Now we will play a game about air pollution. I'm going to spin the wheel, where it stands I want you to tell me the air pollution and why.</p> <p><a href="https://wordwall.net/tr/resource/58557099">https://wordwall.net/tr/resource/58557099</a></p> <p>After this game, each child chooses an air pollution and the teacher informs the parents. The teacher asks them to work on this topic at home and find solutions. Encourages children and families to present as a project assignment.</p>
Assessment	10 min	<p>The teacher encourages children to talk about means of transport.</p> <p>How do means of transport pollute the environment? What do you think?</p> <p>What can we do to prevent pollution?</p> <p>What was the pollution that affected you the most during the</p>
