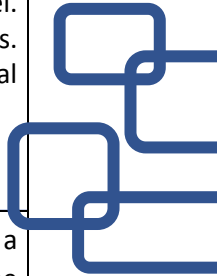


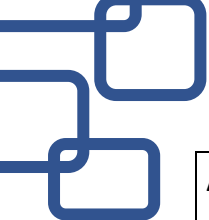

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Lesson Outline

Phase of the lesson	Duration	Description
Warm-up	10 min	<p>Begin the lesson by greeting the students and discussing the importance of taking care of our environment and the impact of waste on the planet.</p> <p>The teacher opens the video below in order to raise awareness of children about pollution sources.</p> <p>https://youtu.be/ODni_Bey154</p>
Main activity	10 min	<p>Now let's play a game about our waste. I'll give you the wheel. When it stops, we will talk about which type of waste it shows. These wastes will be plastic waste, glass waste, paper waste, metal waste, organic waste and battery waste. So let's start.</p> <p>https://wordwall.net/tr/resource/58562417</p>
	15 min	<p>After the above activity, the teacher makes the children play a game. In this game, kids can learn about recycling and the importance of properly disposing of waste while having fun.</p> <p>https://kids.nationalgeographic.com/games/action-adventure/article/recycle-roundup-new</p> <p>After this game, the teacher tells the children that they need to collect materials to make recycling bins.</p> <p>What materials do we need to make recycling bins like in the game?</p> <p>What materials do you see around you that can be recycled?</p>
	10 min	<p>Kids, did you know that there used to be dinosaurs in our world? Dinosaurs became extinct because of humans mistreating the environment. They are no longer alive. Curious about dinosaurs? Let's watch.</p> <p>https://youtu.be/G3gXWDYpLAE</p>





Assessment	5 min	Invites children to talk about waste and dinosaurs. Discusses with children what can be done to reduce pollution sources.
