Phase of the lesson	Duration	Description	
Warm- up	5 min	Engage children in some physical exercises for refreshment: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mndxc0i6MKs">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mndxc0i6MKs</a> Dear all, as a reminder of the beauties we encountered yesterday on our short walk in the park, I've brought you an interesting puzzle. Main activity	10	Engage children in a new game and explain its rules. My dear children, what about talking about the park we visited yesterday? We chat and occasionally make a few stops on our way. Each stop corresponds to a challenge/challenge, which you have to solve. How about joining me on this short journey? 	15	Test 2: Ask children about the benefits of parks. Why does every city have more parks?  Discuss with the children and then invite them to watch the video. Explain the unknown words. Assessm	5	Ask the children if they remember the things they saw in the park and then introduce the new game that checks what knowledge the children have acquired. Identify weaknesses and engage them in other similar activities to remedy the problems.  https://www.twinkl.com.hk/resource/the-park-interactive-word-mat-activity-tg-68-newlink  Use informal verbal formative assessment related to children's performance as you observe, listen and participate in experiences with children. For older preschoolers, involve them in the assessment. Your feedback should be immediate, specific, positive, focusing on performance and helping children to self-correct (Are you sure the picture illustrates? What do you think?).
	5	Ask the children to draw an element/element/landscape on the interactive board that captures your visit to the park. ## Conclusions and recommendations

- Involve the child in experiential learning
- Change the role of the learner: from the object of learning to the active subject of learning
- Choose activities that shape/develop children's logical (critical) thinking.
- Parks are actually an incredibly important part of modern society, encouraging the development of a healthy community. Whether you're jogging and exercising or taking your kids to the playground for fun, parks facilitate these activities. In addition, parks are great for the environment, providing the much-needed greenery.

• Carefully design the multimedia learning sequence, asking yourself: "Why am I using the computer/a particular multimedia system?", "Who am I addressing?", "How will this system help children approach the content and achieve the objectives?", "What is expected, practically, from the children?'

Follow up: the neighbourhood playground is a very fun playground for any child, but also a place where children can get hurt! So what you need to do is be very responsible and careful! Invite your kids to listen to this song to see how to be safe at the park!
