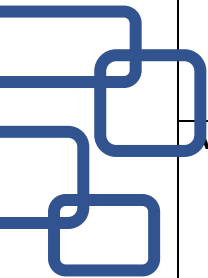

<b>Subject/Discipline</b>	Language and communication- mother tongue
<b>Weekly theme</b>	Traditions
<b>Age group</b>	6
<b>Main topic</b>	Students will become more familiar with world culture and realize how many traditions and other cultures exist.

Lesson Outline

Phase of the lesson	Duration	Description
<b>Warm-up</b>	10min	Discussion - What are traditions? Students and the teacher discuss what traditions are and whether all countries have them. Students present examples of Lithuanian traditions. We come to the conclusion that traditions are how each country celebrates holidays, what clothes they wear, and how they behave.
<b>Main activity</b>	15min	Activity - is it a Lithuanian tradition? The teacher shows various photos, there is a discussion about which photos depict Lithuanian tradition and which do not.  We are talking about the fact that there are people living in Lithuania and the world who have completely different traditions than we do, so we must respect and understand not only our own traditions, but also those of other people. This is called tolerance.
	10min	Students watch a video about Lithuania and Lithuanian traditions, answer the questions: <a href="https://edpuzzle.com/media/64886e9cc45654431724045e">https://edpuzzle.com/media/64886e9cc45654431724045e</a>
	15min	The mind map is filled in with the teacher's help. The topic is Lithuanian traditions. <a href="https://app.mindmup.com/">https://app.mindmup.com/</a>
	5min	Summary. What did you learn? What Lithuanian tradition did you already know?
<b>Assessment</b>	5min	Students are able to describe the word traditions. Realizes that every nation has its own traditions. Understands that there are people in the world whose traditions are very different from ours, but this must be respected and understood.
